

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INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

AP University of Applied Sciences and Arts has a wide range of activities and expertise in different international funding programmes. In the last few years we have been involved both as coordinator or partner in a large number of challenging international projects (Erasmus+, Creative **Europe, Fundamental Rights and** Citizenship, AMIF, ERDF/Interreg, **Youth in Action, Tempus, Erasmus** Mundus, ESF, ...). Dynamic international partner networks support the development of innovative and interdisciplinary project ideas at AP.

In 2022-2023 not less than 29 of our international projects are being implemented in different programmes: Erasmus+ Cooperation Partnerships (13), European Regional Development Fund/Interreg (6), Creative Europe (3), Erasmus+ Capacity Building (3), Erasmus+ Knowledge Alliance (1), Erasmus+ Teacher Academy (1), Erasmus Mundus Design Measures (1), and Cohesion Policy (1).

'European Opera Academy - An innovative approach to Opera' (EOA) is one of these projects.

AP aims to organize each year a couple of blended intensive programmes in cooperation with other higher education institutions. The programmes are a new opportunity funded by the Erasmus+ programme. During these blended intensive programmes, groups of students and/or staff from partner institutions undertake, together with AP students, a short-term physical mobility at AP, combined with a virtual component, facilitating collaborative online learning exchange and teamwork.

AP is part of multiple networks.

One of them is the **European Opera Academy** (EOA), a platform of different music academies in Europe which open up best practices in opera education for young professionals. EOA is a meeting point for international benchmarking in professional opera education.

The EOA offers additional possibilities, new courses and production facilities for their own and visiting students.

They are open to development, exchange and innovation - they have connections with opera houses, vocal


competitions and festivals, allowing them to provide students with the best possible environment

Every year a new selection of modules is being offered to students who can select these modules as their traineeship, as an exchange period within the framework of Erasmus + or as a Blended Intensive Project (BIP).

EOA also generated an innovation project EOAlab. The vision of this project is to trigger innovation in the opera field in Europe and

beyond. **EOALAB** aims to reinforce the link between education, training and labour market through innovative student-centred teaching and learning approaches, by strengthening cross-border collaboration and exchange of best practices to make opera training laboratories for artistic experimentation and employability both for students and young professionals. This project intends to offer new answers to the emerging needs of contemporary opera making.

RESEARCH AND SERVICES

AP University of Applied Sciences and Arts conducts research in a great variety of disciplines. The diversity of its study areas offers a wide range of possibilities for the development of multidisciplinary research. A total of 17 research groups are housed within 6 departments, an Innovation Lab and 2 Schools of Arts. Each group operates in a defined thematic and multidisciplinary framework.



RESEARCH POLICY

The diversity of AP's research is even more enhanced by the fact that the practice-based scientific research and the artistic research both have their own specific characteristics.

Nevertheless, the following general principles apply for all research within AP:

- * Both the artistic and practicebased research start from a definition of a problem related to the actual artistic or professional practice.
- * Research leads to innovative insights (artistic, professional and sometimes also theoretical and methodological) and high-quality output with impact. This output is diverse and adapted to the needs of the respective field of work. Within the Schools of Arts research output generally takes an artistic form.

SERVICES

Researchers at AP collaborate intensively with companies and institutions in their field of work. This intensive collaboration ensures that the results and output of research projects find their way to professionals in the workplace and it also enhances the relation between research and services at AP University of Applied Sciences and Arts.

SCIENCE COMMUNICATION


AP is engaged in science communication to the general public. Each year, the Antwerp University Association (AUHA) organises a Science Day with workshops and demonstrations by researchers. AP also organises STEM workshops for young children. In these workshops children are actively engaged in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, coached by students of our Education & Training department.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

AP supports students who want to combine studying with starting their own business by providing information, network opportunities and tailor-made special facilities. Entrepreneurial students can also rely on TAKEOFFANTWERP, an alliance of the Antwerp University Association with the city of Antwerp. TAKEOFFANTWERP offers working space, seminars, coaching for starters and networking opportunities.

ENGLISH DEGREE PROGRAMMES ROYAL ACADEMY OF FINE ARTS ANTWERP

Being artful and thinking critically, that is what the **Royal Academy of Fine Arts Antwerp** is about. Our academic bachelor and master programmes in visual arts offer a variety of choices: from independent artforms like painting, sculpture, installation art, printmaking and photography, to the more applied arts like fashion, theatre costume design, jewellery design and graphic design.

COSTUME DESIGN

Theatre has become an artistic melting pot where elements from performance art are mixed with visual arts and multimedia. The Costume Design department offers a programme that combines the exploration of the medium 'theatre' with the study of contemporary art. This programme is not training students to merely become 'costume makers', but rather designers of theatre costumes, which demands a lot more. We expect students to have an interest in culture and social themes.

FASHION (NOT FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS)

Fashion Design at the Antwerp Royal Academy of Fine Arts is undoubtedly one of the world's leading programmes. The fashion programme at the Antwerp Academy emphasises the development of an artistic and innovative fingerprint. Students will be encouraged to work with new forms, original remakes of materials and alternative, creative processes. As a soon-to-be fashion designer students are looking forward to new and unexpected experiences. Through the years, many graduates have earned international renown due to their artistic and personal characteristic fashion designs.

FINE ARTS IN SITU3

In Situ3 is an open study programme which emphasises two principles: the specific situation and the individual approach. The students investigate various sites, their historic, social and aesthetic context and experiment with diverse materials and techniques. Each academic year starts with a workshop abroad followed up during the year with visits to exhibitions and other cultural events.

FINE ARTS PAINTING

This course is a balance between 'language proficiency' and personal artistic experience and development.

The Bachelor degree is based chiefly on working from observation such as still life, figure, portrait and landscape.

FINE ARTS PRINTMAKING

Practicing printmaking as a high-level set of skills, students are stimulated to apply it as a contemporary visual language expressing their personal artistic research. Students will acquire all the printmaking techniques needed to build a strong technical background enabling them to 'think through print'. Topics such as intaglio, block printing, lithography and silkscreen are some of those included.

FINE ARTS SCULPTURE

To develop a thorough coordination of hand, eye and body actions is crucial to discover the true creative potential of sculpture. More than creating a mimetic representation of reality students will be challenged to articulate a highly personal artistic strategy. One of the main studio subjects is composition. The aim of composition is to help students detach from the formal limitations of figure study. This allows them to develop and sharpen their artistic scope, be it in a more figurative realm or another direction. During the master programme students are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to address an autonomous artistic proposal and translate it into a cohesive (sculptural) body of work.

GRAPHIC DESIGN

The Graphic Design department emphasises the interaction and relationship between different artistic disciplines including layout, illustration, multimedia, typography, photography and drawing. Students deepen their knowledge and understanding of graphic design by doing practical assignments, workshops and exercises while studying the discipline's history, digital techniques and production. They also take part in an internship to gain experience.

JEWELLERY DESIGN & GOLD- AND SILVERSMITHING

This programme is a platform for exploring creativity and design through the subject of jewellery. With a focus on production techniques we work in a variety of materials including precious metals, synthetics, wood and textiles. In a structured curriculum, we provide affective learning blocks for both making and designing, during which students are expected to develop their individual creative identity. We invite guest lecturers, give workshops and arrange visits to symposiums and exhibitions across Europe to cultivate a good understanding of the broad spectrum of jewellery design in a contemporary world.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The department of Photography aspires to form artists/photographers by making them conscious of technical, conceptual and aesthetical aspects of the medium. Professionals with an active career in the field will guide you through creative processes. Theoretical and critical courses are aimed to familiarise students with historical and contemporary photographic practices and technologies/Through producing, presenting and interpreting images, students develop an authentic voice. Alumni of our department find their way as autonomous artists, free-lance photographers, curators, critics or educators.



ROYAL CONSERVATOIRE ANTWERP

DANCE

The Dance programme consists of three varied, professional, and competency-focused years of study. Students will be confronted with different styles of contemporary dance, choreographers and artists. These encounters will encourage them to become dancers with their own authentic personality. As a contemporary dancer, they are capable of redefining rather than duplicating. The programme maintains lively contact with international dance companies and organisations. Students will also collaborate with other disciplines such as music, theatre and visual arts.

MUSIC

The Music programme consists of an academic Bachelor (180 credits) and Master's (120 credits) degree and trains independent and creative musicians to master their main discipline: instrumental, singing, conducting, composing, music theory/harmony and counterpoint, music education or jazz and popular music. The programme guides students in the development of an artistic identity. It addresses and provides guidance concerning how to create interdisciplinary projects, shape their own artistic project and manage the aspects of communication, promotion and public relations.





As most degree programmes are taught in Dutch, we have created a wide variety of programmes taught in English which you can choose from as an exchange student. We also offer minors in Dutch for Dutch-speaking exchange students. Erasmus Belgica students can create a tailor-made programme by selecting courses from the regular degree programmes. 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ACCEPTANCE

After the deadline, a selection will take place within the department/School of Arts. Make sure that you send in all your documents before the deadline or your application will not be considered.

You will be advised about your acceptance/refusal by email.

WELCOME WEEK

Before the start of each semester, you will also have the opportunity to attend the welcome week to get to know more about the Dutch language and Antwerp culture. This will prepare you for your mobility period and help you meet other international students.

For 5 days before the start of the semester, a Dutch Basic Language course will be organised in combination with cultural visits in Antwerp. The week finishes with a full day of information sessions. This welcome week is highly recommended for all exchange students as it will facilitate your integration during the exchange period.

Estimated cost of living:

VISA AND INSURANCE

f you are a national of a European Economic Area country or from Monaco or Switzerland you may travel to Belgium with a national passport or identity card.

If you have any other nationality you have to apply for a student visa (type D) with the Belgian embassy or consulate in your current country of residence before leaving for Belgium.

Having a European Union residence permit from another EU country is not sufficient because upon arrival in Belgium you will have to present the same documents to the immigration office as for a student visa (type D) application.


If you have dual citizenship (for example non-EU and EU) and you are not currently a resident of an EU country, we strongly advise you to apply for a visa.
