

# Application form for admission to a bachelor programme with a foreign diploma

## Do you have a foreign diploma and would you like to register for a bachelor programme at AP University College Antwerp?

Check <https://www.ap.be/toelatingsvoorwaarden-voor-bachelors> to see if your previously obtained diploma gives you access to a bachelor programme.

## Do you have a different foreign diploma, obtained outside the EU?

You must apply for admission by filling in this form and adding the necessary documents:

- a) A certified copy of the diploma concerned;
- b) A certified Dutch translation issued by a sworn translator, unless originally in English, French, or German;
- c) A declaration from the embassy or consulate of the candidate's country stating that this diploma grants access to a bachelor programme in the country in which it was obtained, unless the diploma itself contains such declaration.

For a bachelor programme organised by a department (Health & Social Care, Management & Communication, Education & Training or Science & Technology), you must submit all documents to the departmental secretariat by the 1<sup>st</sup> of September at the latest.

For a programme organised by a School of Arts (Royal Academy of Fine Arts Antwerp or Royal Conservatoire Antwerp) you must submit all documents to the student secretariat by October 15<sup>th</sup> at the latest.

The admissions committee will examine your application and will inform you of the decision in writing.

## Are you not Dutch speaking?

When registering for a Dutch programme you must prove that you have sufficient knowledge of the Dutch language:

- by submitting a certificate of at least one successfully completed year in Dutch-language secondary education;
- by submitting a pass certificate in a programme or in one or more courses in Dutch-language higher education, with a total study load of at least 60 ECTS-credits, or
- by submitting a pass certificate for the Interuniversity Dutch Language Test for Foreign Language Speakers ('Interuniversitaire Taaltest Nederlands voor Anderstaligen – ITNA'), or for the Dutch state examination NT2 II, or a different certificate from a centre for adult education or a recognised language centre. The required Dutch language level is B2 CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference).

The Dutch language test ITNA was developed by the language centres of four Flemish universities. The language test is conducted by Linguapolis, among others: <https://www.uantwerpen.be/en/centres/linguapolis/>

## Attention:

- This language requirement does not apply to the academic bachelor programme in Music or the professional bachelor programme in Dance.
- When registering for the English academic bachelor programme in Visual Arts, you must prove that you have sufficient knowledge of the English language. This can be done in various ways:
  - by submitting a certificate of graduation ASO-diploma (Flemish candidate-students) or VWO (Dutch candidate-students), or
  - by submitting a certificate of at least one successfully completed year in English-language secondary education, or
  - by submitting a pass certificate in a programme or in one or more courses in English-language higher education, with a total study load of at least 60 credits, or
